QUESTION 1: During the 2018 session, the NYS Assembly passed the "Child Victims Act" as a one-house bill; the legislation proposes to extend the statute of limitations for sexual abuse criminal and civil cases. Under current law, the five year statute of limitations for bringing a criminal case begins when the victim reaches age 18. Under the bill, the five year statute of limitations would begin when the victim reaches age 23. As for civil cases, the current law starts the statute of limitations at age 18, under the proposed legislation, the victim would be able to bring a suit up to the age of 50 years old.



QUESTION 2: The Reproductive Health Act aligns New York State law with protections guaranteed under the U.S. Constitution. The bill removes abortion from the Penal law which was enacted three years before the Roe v. Wade decision. Under the proposal, duly licensed health care practitioners may perform the procedure within 24 weeks of pregnancy, when there is an absence of fetal viability, or when necessary to protect the woman's life or health. Would you support passage of the Reproductive Health Act into law?



QUESTION 3: The Gender Expression Non-Discrimination Act (GENDA) is a bill that expands the rights of transgender individuals and seeks to prohibit discrimination based on gender identity or expression and expands New York State's hate crime laws to include crimes against people because of their gender identity or expression. Do you support the passage of GENDA into law?



QUESTION 4: The burden of student loan debt has a profound impact on the economy and not only impacts the financial decisions of the student borrowers but also the parents and guardians who may assist in financing higher education.

QUESTION 10: The proposed New York State DREAM Act would provide funding for the children of immigrants to attend college. Do you support the DREAM Act?



QUESTION 11: The Governor has made it a priority to encourage shared services between municipalities. Which of the below services would you be most supportive in sharing?



QUESTION 12: Medicaid is generally the highest cost to county governments. It would cost the state \$2.3 billion to take over Medicaid management from the fifty-five counties outside New York City. Would you be willing to assume the cost of a state takeover in the State budget if it meant either an increase in State taxes or decrease in State services in order to lower your local property taxes?



QUESTION 13: Vacation rental websites, such as Airbnb, Homeaway, and VRBO, are online marketplaces that enable homesharing. Provided that they are required to pay all related taxes and are compliant with current building codes, would you support these types of businesses in New York?



QUESTION 14: Despite additional charges of corruption there has been little progress in the way of meaningful ethics reform. What in your opinion is the most important ethics reform measure that New York should enact?



QUESTION 15: Term Length - Currently, New York State legislators are elected to a two year term.

Do you support legislators continuing to serve two year terms (every two years having to run for re-election)?



If you answered no to (a), would you support a constitutional amendment that would increase in the length of a term to four years?



QUESTION 16: Term Limits – Currently New York State legislators are not subject to term limits, which means they can run for an unlimited number of two year terms.



QUESTION 17: Currently, New York has a medical marijuana program in place; however it has not legalized marijuana for recreational use. To date, seven states, including neighboring Massachusetts, have legalized marijuana for recreational use.

Do you support the full legalization of marijuana in New York?

QUESTION 18: When considering how to allocate the State's financial resources, which categories are your highest priorities? (rank highest priority as 1 – lowest priority as 13)



QUESTION 19: Supporting small businesses is a priority of mine and I frequently hear about the need for regulatory reforms to remove onerous burdens on small businesses to allow them to grow and succeed. Currently, I carry a bill that would attempt to relieve some of the burden by providing relief from regulatory fines for first-time offenses that do not impact health, safety, or the environment. What do you think is the biggest impediment for small businesses?



QUESTION 20: The unfortunate reality of the heroin epidemic is that many of us have been touched by it in some shape or form. What obstacles do you see in prevention, treatment, and recovery? What if any thoughts do you have on how we can be more effective in battling this growing problem?



QUESTION 21: Just over 90 % of patients continued to receive prescription opioids after an overdose. More than half receive the prescription from the same doctor who prescribed the drugs that led to the overdose. If you are prescribed opioids, do you think a healthcare professional should be notified if you have had a drug overdose on opioids or heroin or that such information should be placed on a registry available to healthcare providers before she/he prescribes additional opioids?



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QUESTION 22: Controlled safe injection sites have been proposed as a method of preventing deaths from overdoses. Would you support safe injection sites that allow supervised drug use?
