Phil introduced and passed bills to

- ✓ Prohibit the sale of synthetic Kratom products, commonly known as "Gas Station Heroin" (A.9156-B)
- ✓ Require large social media companies to comply with search warrants within 72 hours (A.8022-A)
- ✓ Direct the Office of Addiction Services and Supports to provide test strips capable of detecting dangerous adulterants such as Medetomidine, Benzodiazepines, and Nitazenes (A.9001)
- ✓ Ensure that all FDA-approved opioid reversal agents are available in New York State (A.265-A)
- ✓ Require all commercial health insurance plans to provide outpatient coverage for gambling addiction treatment (A.8518)
- ✓ Direct the New York State Office for the Aging to provide training for senior service providers and senior center employees on recognizing, reporting, and responding to abuse (A.582-A)

Phil cosponsored and passed bills to

- ✓ Increase tax credits for volunteer firefighter and ambulance workers (A.6790-A)
- ✓ Require greater transparency on utility bills so consumers know exactly what they are being charged for (A.8414)
- ✓ Prohibit companies from using personal data to inflate the costs of goods and services online (A.9349-B)
- ✓ Expand access to plug in solar devices to help keep energy costs down and combat climate change (A.9111-C)
- ✓ Prohibit auto insurance companies from using factors such as occupation, education level, homeownership, and zip code of the insurance recipient when determining car insurance rates (A.10005-C)
- ✓ Enact "Francesco's Law" to strengthen safe storage requirements for firearms (A.1962-B)

Our work isn't over

Assemblymember Steck will continue championing legislation:

- Protecting the rights of those with disabilities by eliminating the subminimum wage for workers with disabilities (A.1006-B)
- Saving taxpayer dollars by allowing municipalities to join self-funded or self-insured county health plans (A.1766-B)
- Helping our most vulnerable by compensating parents of medically fragile children for caregiving when private duty nurses are not available (A.464-B)
- Lowering prescription drug costs for New Yorkers by prohibiting Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) operating in the state from owning, operating, controlling, or directing a pharmacy (A.6546)
- Restoring a key source of revenue for New York by reinstating the Stock Transfer Tax of 0.1% on the sale of stock (A.1494-B)
- Protecting workers by prohibiting the abusive practice of split shifts (When a worker is under the control of the employer without pay for periods longer than an hour) (A.1000-A)
