

Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



Helping Hartford schools

Working with district Superintendent Andrew Cook, Assemblywoman Woerner helped provide \$250,000 in grant funding for the Hartford Central School District to improve the safety of the elementary school entrance, as well as install a new generator. She also secured an additional \$125,000 for the Hartford Central School District in 2016, 2017 and 2018.



Supporting volunteer firefighters

Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure a \$125,000 grant for the Hartford Volunteer Fire Company for the purchase of a new fire truck.



Fighting for our future farmers

Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$500,000 in grant funding for the Greenwich Future Farmers of America (FFA) to purchase ag-tech equipment, which is shared between local FFA programs in Washington County, including the Hartford FFA chapter.



Protecting local history

To preserve a piece of Hartford history, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 to preserve and reinvigorate the Civil War Enlistment Center - the last remaining Civil War enlistment center in New York State - and the Elisha Straight House, which houses the Hartford Museum. Both buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



"The town has been incrementally setting money aside to perform the rehab, but the building was deteriorating faster than we could save for. With Carrie's help, we were able to dramatically move up the timeline for the work in order to save the last remaining Civil War enlistment center in New York State. This is part of our heritage and no other town in NY can boast of this." – *Town of Hartford Supervisor Dana Haff*
