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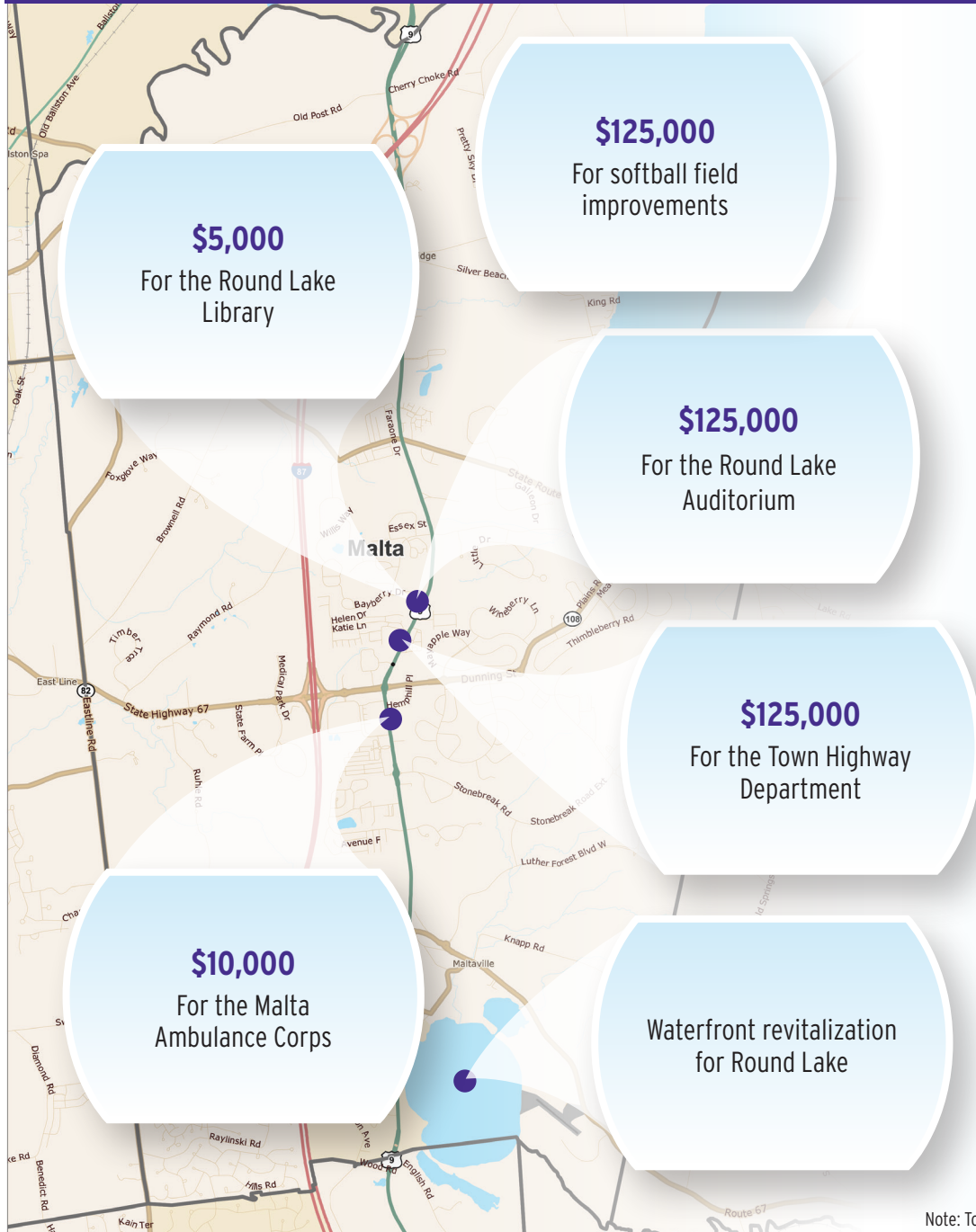

Taking care of the Town of Malta



Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



Keeping Malta safe

At the Town's request, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 for the replacement of the Town Highway Department diesel and gas fuel storage tanks. These substances are highly volatile, making their replacement crucial for keeping Malta families safe. The funding will also be used to install a fire suppression system.

Round Lake Auditorium

Since the late 1800s, the Round Lake Auditorium has hosted a variety of concerts, theater programs and art shows. The renovation of this space is being facilitated by Assemblywoman Woerner, who is working to secure \$125,000 in funding for the project to revitalize this important community hub.

Providing our community with better medical care

Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$10,000 in funding for the Malta Ambulance Corps, an important provider of emergency medical transport in the area, for upgrades to patient care.



Supporting our library

Assemblywoman Woerner has worked to give the Round Lake Library, a centerpiece of the community for over 100 years, \$5,000 in funding to purchase desktop computers. This will help the library modernize and allow it to give its patrons access to computers and the internet.

Enhancing community resources

Every child should have access to safe, outdoor fun. To this end, the Assemblywoman secured a grant for \$125,000 for the addition of lights and field improvements at town softball fields.

Revitalizing our waterfront

To provide local communities with critical funding, Assemblywoman Woerner sponsored and passed legislation to include Round Lake in the list of inland waterways eligible for the local waterfront revitalization program (Ch. 133 of 2018).
