

## Supporting historic preservation

Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 in funding to support preservation efforts at the historic Salem Courthouse. Funds will be used for exterior repairs, restoration of courtroom windows and upgrading the heating system. The Historic Salem Courthouse Preservation Association has made significant progress with its restoration of this community landmark.



## Enhancing local libraries

In this digital age, libraries continue to serve as hubs in our communities and help residents access technology. Assemblywoman Woerner helped obtain \$5,000 for the Bancroft Public Library to purchase new technology, including laptops, play pads, e-readers, a barcode reader, printer and additional office supplies and equipment.

## Enhancing emergency services

Assemblywoman Woerner will always place the health and safety of Salem families first. To enhance local emergency services, she helped provide \$10,000 for the Salem Rescue Squad to purchase a defibrillator. These dedicated emergency service volunteers need the up-to-date equipment to best aid community members.



## Renovating local infrastructure

Assemblywoman Woerner knows the importance of maintaining our roadways. That's why she secured \$125,000 for renovations to the Town of Jackson Highway Garage.
