







ASSEMBLYMAN ROBERT SMULLEN'S

RURAL EQUITY INITIATIVE

The Rural Equity Initiative, developed by me and my colleagues in the Assembly Minority Conference, includes proposals that focus on:



Economic Development and Resurgence by creating a "Rural Equity Assistance" program to foster economic development in small towns, provide technical assistance, identify grants and other funding sources (A.1913) and incentivize remote workers to live in rural regions of the state (A.1909);



Providing equal access to services and telecommunications infrastructure by increasing Medicaid reimbursements for rural ambulance service (A.1928), allowing municipalities to cooperatively develop plans for internet access in rural communities (A.2378) and establishing the "Rural Mobile Communications Fund," which would provide grants to expand cellular coverage (A.2024);



Addressing unique rural education needs by allowing schools to focus on investing in education rather than chasing a zero-emission standard for school

transportation (A.2005), permitting rural students to enroll in classes and programs offered at schools around the region through the "EmpowerED" Act (A.2009) and expanding parent contracts so schools can contract with parents, teachers and other community members to meet transportation needs (A.2011); and



Preserving the heritage and history of rural New York

by creating the "Adopt-a-Rural Cemetery Program" to provide assistance in maintaining and upgrading these important facilities (A.2034) and exempting the use of wood burning for recreation, home heating and cooking from greenhouse gas emission reduction requirements (A.2003).
