What is EPIC?

The Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC) program is a New York State program for seniors administered by the Department of Health.

This year's budget saw an increase of \$1 million to the EPIC program, totaling \$132.66 million, to help seniors afford their medications.

To join EPIC, a senior must:

- Be a New York State resident;
- Have an annual income below \$75,000 if single or \$100,000 if married;
- Be enrolled or eligible to enroll in Medicare Part D (no exceptions); and
- Not be receiving full Medicaid benefits.

Fighting for Our Seniors

This is the third budget in a row in which the Legislature has successfully prevented the governor from making drastic cuts to important senior reimbursements. It's our job to protect our seniors by making sure they can afford to stay in their homes, providing them with essential services, and protecting their fixed incomes. This year, I am pleased to say that the Legislature:

- Rejected the governor's plan to cap Medicare B reimbursements; and
- Prevented the governor from eliminating the Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA).

Golden Park Program

If you are a New York State resident 62 or older, on any weekday (except holidays), you can obtain:

- ➤ Free vehicle access to state parks, boat launch sites and arboretums (except at Walkway Over the Hudson State Historic Park, Irondequoit Bay State Marine and Earl W. Brydges Artpark State Park); and
- > Fee reduction to state historic sites and state-operated golf courses.

You can do the above simply by presenting your currently valid New York State Driver License or New York State Non-Driver Identification Card.*

Senior Citizens Real Property Tax Exemption

Local governments and school districts in New York State can opt to grant a reduction on the amount of property taxes paid by qualifying senior citizens. This is accomplished by reducing the taxable assessment of the senior's home.

To qualify, seniors generally must be 65 years of age or older and meet certain income limitations and other requirements. To see if your locality provides a tax exemption, call your local assessor.

This year, Assembly Bill **A.1603** was passed and signed by the governor, excluding income from an exchange of an annuity that results in non-taxable gain from being considered as income when qualifying for the Senior Citizens Real Property Tax Exemption.
