Dear Assemblymember Lupardo and Senator Webb:

Thank you for your letter requesting nformation on a potential natural gas development project in the Southern Tier. Please tote that as of the date of this letter, DEC has not been contacted by Southern Tier CC2 Clean Energy Solutions (Southern Tier) regarding the project described in the letters received by landowners. The only information DEC currently has on the potential project has come through a review of their website and the letters landowners have shared with us.

As with any proposed project, if DEC were to receive permit applications for drilling in the Marcellus and Utica shales, the use of produced gas as fuel to generate electricity, or any other component of the company's "plan", DEC would conduct a thorough and transparent review process. DEC's remitting reviews would examine all applicable federal and state standards to ensure the agency's decision is protective of public health and the environment, upholdsenvironmental justice and fairness, and meets applicable standards, including those related to the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (Climate Act) and theState Environmental Quality Review Act. For example, DEC must ensure compliance with the requirements of the Climate Act's Section 7, which includes addressing whether the project is inconsistent with or would interfere with statewide greenhouse as emission limits and ensuring a project would not disproportionately burden disadvantaged communities.

The process described on Southern Tier's website has not been tried yet in New York. Carbon dioxide is used in enhancedoil recovery projects in other states, but DEC is unfamiliar with using it in primary production of natural gas from shale formations. If this project does develop into a proposalby Southern Tier, DEC would coordinate with other states to determine if this technique has been applied elsewhere and if so, what these states have learned through their regulatory process that could inform New York.
