As you may have heard, this will be my last year representing you in the NYS Assembly. Serving in the Assembly has been an incredible honor, but the time has come for a new chapter in my life. I plan to remain active in the community focusing on the many causes and interests that I've worked on over the years. This is truly a wonderful place to live and work and I'm looking forward to joining with others in a new capacity to make it even better.

Enclosed you'll find a summary of some of the things I have been working on this past year, along with a tear-off list of important phone numbers. For those of you have missed our annual survey, a link to an on-line version is also available. If you want to keep up with my activities, we send a monthly eNewsletter to subscribers.

In the meantime, please know that our office is always available to assist you. Our Director of Constituent Services handles numerous calls each day sorting out issues related to your interactions with state agencies such as the Departments of Education, Health, Labor, Motor Vehicles, Transportation, and more. She also provides helpful referrals to local and federal resources, and can assist with NYSEG related questions. My office provides official recognitions for important occasions and celebrations; just call or send us an email.

In Albany, I meet with hundreds of constituents annually to discuss changes they would like to see to the state budget or to state laws. My office receives thousands of emails each year on matters the Legislature is considering. While I can't respond to everyone, I definitely take all of these communications into consideration.

I will continue to focus on the needs of our community in the coming year. This involves addressing gaps in our health care delivery system (including EMS), child care, senior services, food security, housing, energy, and the needs of area businesses, schools, and non-profits. Your feedback is welcome on these or other matters.

Our municipalities and community organizations provide services that support the health, safety, and well-being of our community. We are able to tap into state resources that have helped pay for the improvements these groups have requested. Here are some of the developments that are in the pipeline. These projects were funded by NYS budgets through FY26.

Broome County, Grippen Park:

\$500K to support Broome County's work at the newly renamed Grippen Community Park in Endicott. The park features a fully renovated community building with restrooms, concessions, and an indoor track, along with pickleball courts in the spring and summer seasons and a recreational ice rink for the winter. Other amenities include a new wiffle ball field, basketball court, and rebounding wall. *Completed Summer 2025*




Broome County Veterans Resource Center:

\$500K to support Broome County's development of a comprehensive Veterans Resource Center on the Northside of Binghamton, bringing multiple veteran-serving organizations under one roof. The complex also hosts 10 tiny homes to provide affordable and accessible housing options for veterans. *Completed Fall 2025*



BOCES Trades Complex:

\$1.3M for the construction of a Trades Complex on the BOCES campus to help address a shortage of trade workers and truck drivers. The new facility provides a dedicated indoor space to house heavy equipment vehicles, allowing students to learn through the winter. The project also funded a new truck and roadway to train CDL drivers. BOCES also plans to construct a solar training farm in the near future where students can learn how to install and service solar panels. *Completed Fall 2025*



Village of Johnson City:

\$250K for the renovation of the former public works garage into a Public Safety Training Facility. Renovations will include weatherproofing the building and purchasing equipment such as breach simulators, movable walls, and other training aids. The Village also plans to build a two-story smoke tower for firefighter training. The facility will be used by the Johnson City Police and Fire Departments, and will eventually be open to outside agencies in the Southern Tier as well. *Expected Completion Spring 2026*

Cornell Cooperative Extension of Broome County:

\$750K to renovate the Incubator Kitchen on CCE's Upper Front Street campus. The project will expand kitchen space, construct a new walk-in cooler and dry storage, and provide numerous infrastructure improvements. The renovation will nearly triple the space and be able to support additional local chefs and food entrepreneurs in developing and growing their local businesses. *Expected completion Spring 2026*



YMCA of Broome County:

\$1.2M for a full renovation of the pool at the West Family Branch in Johnson City. The pool is used daily for lap swims, swimming lessons, aqua therapy and group exercises and improvements became a priority after the Binghamton Branch pool was closed to make room for additional housing and shelter space. *Expected completion Summer 2026*



United Way of Broome County:



\$1M for the expansion of the 2-1-1 Susquehanna River Region Community Resource Center. This will help address the capacity limits of their current facility, which currently supports over 35,000 calls and texts each year from community members seeking information and referral to services. The project will provide additional office space for private in-person counseling, along with general improvements to the main building. *Expected completion end of 2026*
