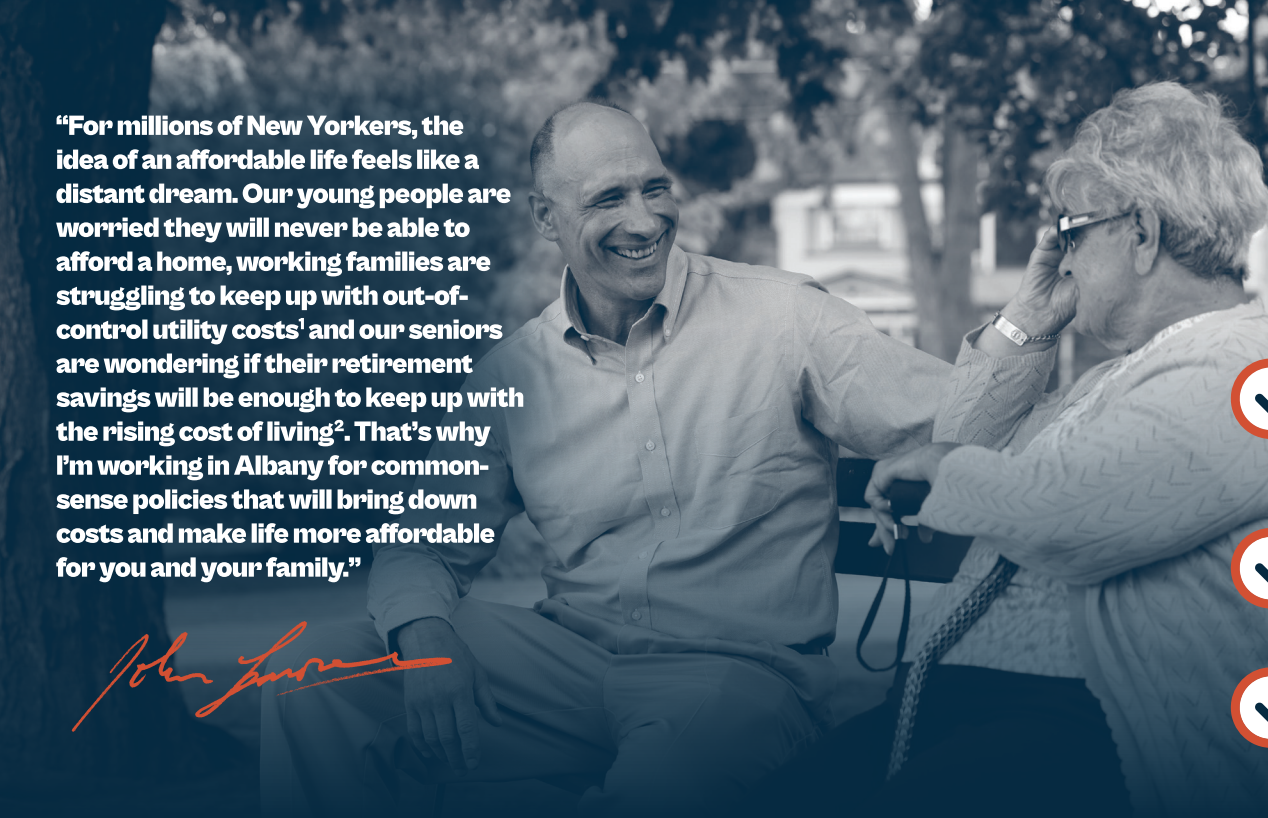

**John Supports Policies That Would
Make Life More Affordable By:**



Scrapping Taxes on Everyday Items

Eliminate the state sales tax on dozens of everyday items for two years, including (but not limited to) gasoline, personal care products, housekeeping supplies and prepared foods. (A.7417)



Eliminate Taxes on Overtime

Subtract from federal adjusted gross income any overtime compensation earned by an individual. (A.8965-A)



Increase Tax Credits for Working New Yorkers

Expand the New York State value of the Earned Income Tax Credit from 30% to 45% of the federal amount and offer the credit as installment payments instead of a lump sum when filing income taxes. (A.2498)



Make Retirement More Attainable by Cutting Taxes on Private Pensions

Make the first \$100,000 of a private pension non-taxable. (A.2017)
