LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

KEEPING THE LIGHTS ON

Assembly extends utility moratorium for New Yorkers impacted by COVID-19 (A.6255-A)

Extends the moratorium until December 31, 2021, unless the state of emergency is lifted prior, and for an additional 180 days after to allow customers still facing financial hardship to enter into payment agreements to avoid shutoffs

Applies to services provided by utility corporations, municipalities, telephone and cable companies, broadband providers and water authorities

Expands moratorium eligibility to include certain small businesses with 25 or fewer employees



While much of the activity in Albany has been focused on budget, we are still passing pieces of legislation that impacts the community. Two pieces of my legislation that have passed the Assembly are below:

A.4424: Previously, I had sponsored legislation that provides a tax credit to those that are

mandated to buy flood insurance in Syracuse because so many of these properties are in low-income communities. This bill will build on that enacted law by allowing homeowners to buy the minimum flood insurance necessary to satisfy obligations to a lender while keeping higher coverage as an option.

A.5379: This bill allows for short-term insurance policies and unanimously passed the Assembly. Under current law, insurance policies must last for at least one year. This is unnecessary as many people engage in side activities for extra income. Someone who occasionally provides ride sharing services doesn't need a one year policy. Updates to outdated laws like this will help with our economic recovery and provide New Yorkers with more options for how they'd like to conduct business.

In the beginning of March, I was invited to Upstate Medical University where they have opened a new Vector Bio-containment Laboratory, a first-of-its-kind facility to

open and operate at Upstate.

The new VBL facility will allow Upstate to conduct more extensive research on infectious diseases such as coronavirus, Lyme disease, West Nile encephalitis, Zika and more. The new lab is a BSL-3, which means it has an advanced biosafety level as dictated by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that includes safety precautions for research on potentially dangerous diseases and their carriers.
