Assemblymember Bronson is putting families first

New York State's new paid family leave program took effect on Jan. 1 and covers:

- Parents during the first year after the birth, adoption or fostering of a child
- Family members caring for a sick relative
- Employees whose spouse, domestic partner, child or parent is on active military duty abroad or will soon be deployed

Under the program, employees:

- Cannot be discriminated against for taking leave
- Have access to health insurance coverage while on leave
- Have full job protection upon return
