## HEAP and Emergency HEAP

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps low-income residents cover the costs of heating their homes, while Emergency HEAP assistance is available for heat-related crises. Eligibility and benefits are based on income, household size, primary heating source and who resides in the house. ## **Prescription Drug Assistance**

The Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC) Program provides copayment assistance for Medicare Part D-covered prescription drugs after any Part D deductible is met. This program also covers many drugs excluded from Medicare Part D. EPIC is available to anyone age 65 or older who is not receiving full Medicaid benefits and whose income is no higher than \$75,000, or \$100,000 if married. ### **COVID-19 Pandemic**

Our communities have faced unprecedented challenges during the COVID-19 pandemic, but resources and support are available for those impacted. Insurance will cover the cost of eight at-home COVID-19 tests per person each month. For details, visit **cms.gov/ how-to-get-your-at-home-OTC-COVID-19-test-for-free**. You can also order four free at-home tests at **covidtests.gov**.

### **Consumer Scam Protection**

Consumer scams have cost people millions of dollars through false promises, inaccurate claims and deceptive practices. Sadly, seniors are often targeted and are less likely to file claims.

Some of the most common scams are: scammers purporting to be from Medicare in order to gain your personal information; scammers who claim you need to hand over information to access an inheritance; telemarketers who ask for a "good faith payment" with the promise of providing a prize; fake charities; investment and reverse mortgage schemes; retail scams in which a caller (often an automated voice) indicates you need to provide financial information to avoid a charge on your credit card; scams in which a thief demands remote access to your device through the guise of a malware attack; and grandparent scams, in which a caller pretends to be a loved one in need or their representative.

Some tips: resist the pressure to act quickly – scammers intentionally try to create a sense of urgency. Be cautious of unsolicited phone calls, mailings and door-to-door offers. Do not download email attachments from unknown senders. Do not provide your personal information in response to unexpected text messages; government agencies and legitimate businesses do not ask for information this way. Verify numbers and addresses as well any requests for money or assistance that are supposedly coming from people you know.

### **Property Tax Relief**

The STAR and Enhanced STAR programs provide eligible seniors with exemptions on the taxable value of their homes, resulting in significant school tax savings. Income and other eligibility criteria may change from year to year.
