AmeriCorps Senior Companion Program

This funding is for programs that engage adults aged 55 and over to provide companionship and support to other adults in need of extra assistance to remain at home or in the community for as long as possible. AmeriCorps Senior Companion program volunteers mainly provide service in the homes of their clients. Among other activities, they provide companionship to ease loneliness and social isolation, assist with transportation and light chores, help to serve as eyes and ears to professionals who can intervene in the case of medical or other deterioration on the part of the clients and give support to informal caregivers.

On the Private Level...

William T. Grant Foundation, Funding for Research to Reduce Inequality

Grants are available for research to build, test or increase understanding of programs, policies or practices to reduce inequality in the academic, social, behavioral or economic outcomes of young people ages five to 25 in the United States, along dimensions of race, ethnicity, economic standing, language minority status or immigrant origins. Grants will be awarded in support of descriptive studies that describe, explore or explain how programs, practices or policies reduce inequality; intervention studies that provide causal evidence on the effectiveness of programs or policies for reducing inequality; and measurement development studies that can enhance the work of researchers, practitioners or policymakers to reduce inequality.

■ Eligible Applicants: The foundation makes grants only to tax-exempt organizations. Grants are not awarded to individuals. Proposals are encouraged from organizations that are under-represented among grantee institutions, including Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Hispanic-serving institutions, Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCUs), Alaska Native-serving institutions, Native Hawaiian-serving institutions and Asian American Native American Pacific Islander serving institutions (AANAPISIs).

Association for Conflict Resolution (ACR)/JAMS Foundation, Initiative for Students and Youth Conflict Resolution Education and Training Grants

Stranahan Foundation, Grants Dedicated to High-Quality Early Care and Education for Low-Income Children

This funding aims to increase access to high-quality early care and education for low-income children (birth to five) by investing in, developing and retaining a high-quality, thriving early educator workforce.

Glen W. Bailey (GWB) Foundation, STEM grants

These grants are for organizations seeking programmatic funding for STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) education at all levels. Applications are invited for four new programs:

- STEM Sprouts: an early education STEM program designed to introduce young children, typically between the ages of three and 10, to the foundational concepts and skills within these four fields
- STEM Stars: middle and high school advanced STEM program funding. Programming can take place before, during or after school. Programs that successfully prepare interested students who wish to be fully prepared for their intended college STEM major by exposing them to advanced topics in science, engineering, computer science and more are encouraged
- STEM Scholars: a postsecondary STEM program aimed at providing colleges and universities with more funding and flexibility for their internal STEM programs. The program offers opportunities to expand on current programs or seed money to create new programs. Funding can support many activities and initiatives such as club activities, career management counselors, showcases, research projects, camps, tech talks, student clubs and organizations, lecture series and professor continuing education programs
