#### THE CASE FOR CAPITAL CITY FUNDING

- 64% of the property in Albany is tax-exempt, and NYS owns nearly 60% of the tax-exempt property
- Current NYS funding to Albany under Sec. 19-a of the Public Lands Law is equivalent to 0.29% of the value of NYS-owned property in Albany








#### NYS owns 38% of Albany's total property value – more than all the tax exempt property in Schenectady, Utica, or Rochester


**Tax Exempt Property as a Percentage of Total Land Value\***


Census Tracts 2 & Med. Household In Per Capita Incor Poverty Rate Homeownership I
