Dear Chair Weinstein and Chair Krueger,

In follow up to the February 27th Joint Legislative Budget Hearings on Higher Education, below and attached, respectively, are my follow-up responses and materials, as requested during the hearing.

1. Chairwoman Stavisky asked if HESC would be able to absorb the cost of TAP awards for the roughly 50 students with intellectual disabilities who participate in nine federally approved Comprehensive Transition Postsecondary (CTP) programs. My staff had met with advocates in October to discuss this issue and felt that with the 2022-23 TAP changes for non-degree programs, students attending an approved CTP program at a community college should be currently eligible; however, those attending programs at a four-year public college, or a private college would not be eligible under the current law. Furthermore, given the limited number of approved programs and low enrollments, the additional TAP costs could be absorbed within existing allocations.

2. Assemblymember Ra asked for updated numbers on the Child Welfare Worker Scholarship (CWWS) and the Child Welfare Worker Loan Forgiveness (CWWLF) program for 2021-22, which are provided below:

*Note, the CWWS and CWWLF applications were not opened to new applicants in 2021-22 because prior year recipients continued to exhaust available funding.

 Senator Krueger requested the names and addresses of the Yeshivas whose students are eligible to receive TAP funds. These have been provided as Attachment A to this letter.

Please also be aware that these special schools (not all of which are Yeshivas), are approved by HESC, but must meet the same criteria as schools approved by the New York State Education Department; as HESC's regulations are modeled after those of the State Education Department Commissioner's. These regulatory requirements mandate that the institution:

- a. be exempt from Federal taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;
- b. have its headquarters and main campus located within the State;
- c. be eligible for funds under title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended:
- d. be accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S.
 Department of Education (Note: the primary accreditor in the U.S. is
 the one utilized primary by our special schools the Association of
 Advanced Rabbinical and Talmudic Schools (AARTS));
- e. certify that its students are eligible to receive Federal Pell grants in accordance with section 1,070 of title 20 of the United States code, et. seq. and the regulations promulgated thereunder;
- f. provide a postsecondary program of instruction in an approved program lasting at least three years, in which the student is enrolled; and
- g. enter into a participation agreement with HESC.

4. Lastly, Assemblymember Epstein questioned what happens to applicants who do not get Excelsior awards. HESC historically has not tracked students who do not receive awards, as our primary charge is to administer financial aid to eligible students. While it is possible to utilize our data and purchase this information, this activity would fall outside of our privacy provisions shared with applicants when they apply for awards (which limits us to utilizing information for purposes of determining eligibility for the award). Please be aware that while students who are determined to be both eligible and ineligible for NYS financial aid awards opt to enroll in an out-of-state college, it is typically at a greater overall cost to the student and their family, given they are charged non-resident tuition by the out-of-state college.
