Re: Budget Hearing – Transportation

On behalf of the New York Building Congress, thank you for the opportunity to present testimony to the Senate and Assembly Committees on Transportation regarding the legislature's efforts to advance a robust transportation agenda that supports the growth and prosperity of New York State.
